## Special Event vs. Sampling Event Permit



This document is to help determine whether an applicant should apply for a Special Event or Sampling Event.

What's the purpose of the event?	Showcasing and selling alcoholic beverages	Showcasing and selling alcoholic beverages
Who can apply?	Licensed Manufacturers only	Any person or establishment
How many permits can be issued per year?	No more than 20 permits for the same physical location per calendar year	Only 4 permits can be issued per year
How long can the event last?	For the duration of the public event or 4 days, whichever is shorter	For not more than 4 consecutive days
Is an admission fee required?	No, there is no fee required. However, charging a fee is allowed	Yes, attendees are required to pay an attendance fee of at least \$5
Where is consumption allowed?	Within the boundaries of the event. The event's permit can be held at an already licensed establishment	Within the boundaries of the event. The event's permit can be held at an already licensed establishment
What drink limits must be followed? Can more than one permit happen at the same time?	Yes, but each manufacturer must have their own permit for the event	No, not at the same location at the same time
